
Our History:


Each year, the non-profit <u>World War II Foundation</u> partners with significant colleges, universities, and organizations nationwide to introduce young filmmakers, photographers, and historians to the experience of filming a World War II documentary overseas, utilizing video, still photography, and teaching history.

Italy

2024 Trip:

In 2024 (June 19-27) The World War II Foundation will be taking student filmmakers and historians to Germany to focus on the rise of Nazism and antisemitism in Germany, which led directly to the

beginning of World War II. We will be based in Salzburg, Austria, for eight days, and the film we will be



producing for global airing on American Public Television/PBS.

While the historic city of Salzburg will be our base, and we will explore its role in WWII, as well as its fantastic history of culture, we will also be visiting as part of the making of this globally aired documentary:

- *The Dachau Concentration Camp.
- *The city of Nuremberg (home of the infamous Nuremberg rallies leading up to the start of WWII).
- *The mountainous village of Berchtesgaden (Adolf Hitler's home) in the Bavarian Alps
- *Salzburg, Austria (WWII filming & Sound of Music Tour)
- *Munich, Germany



Munich, Germany

<u>In 2024</u>, we expect roughly 22 students from four universities to join us, along with a professor or representative from each university to oversee their group of students. The students will work directly with the film crew on the trip as film credited Production Assistants. This is a very hands-on trip for students, and they will be involved each day with our crew, from the videographer and director to the historians who will also be on the journey with us. We travel to each location on a beautiful large luxury bus.

One of the actual benefits of this trip, as an aside, is the building in of lots of extra time for the students to work on their projects, as assigned by their schools, and the

opportunity to spend time exploring non-World War II related sites, such as museums and the city of Munich itself. The trip combines World War II, local history, and culture.

Based on our most recent costs of film trips to Italy, France, and Switzerland, at this time, it is *estimated* the trip will be roughly \$3,800 per person with double occupancy. Airfare is not included.

Over the past few years each school has sought out sponsors, donors, and scholarship opportunities to defray the costs of the trip, at least partially. The World War II Foundation is also actively searching for program sponsors for the trip.

As an aside, on our first program trip in 2022 with Syracuse and San Diego State represented, we had 4 students. In 2023, that increased to 16 students from Georgia, Syracuse, Davidson College and one student from the University of Rhode Island. The trip is life-changing for many of these film and history majors, many of whom had never left the United States and were very excited to acquire their first ever Passport.
